DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

READ: Revelation 1:9-20

- Why is John on the island of Patmos, and why is that significant?
- Why can it be hard to connect with John's statement about being companions in the suffering and patient endurance that is shared in Jesus?
- If you were to write a letter to our church, how would you complete this sentence: "I write to you as companions of _____?" (Try to write it without saying God or Jesus).
- Have you ever been "in the spirit?" (verse 10)
- John is asked to write to seven churches. Why is the number seven significant in Revelation?
- When John turns around in verse 12, he sees seven golden lampstands. According to verse 20, what do the lampstands represent?
- Who is standing amidst the seven lampstands?
- Why is it significant to see Jesus stand among these seven churches even though they all have their challenges and issues?
- Do you think that is the case today?
- Why does John use all this symbolism to describe his encounter with Jesus?
- How is John's fear in verse 17 both understood by us and yet undesired by Jesus?
- What does it mean that Jesus is the First and the Last?
- Why would Jesus need keys to death and hell?
- What does it mean that John is asked to write about what he has seen, what is now, and what will take place?
- Why is it important that the cross of Christ keeps showing up in Revelation?
